Glen began his legal career as an Assistant District Attorney under Robert Morgenthau in Manhattan.



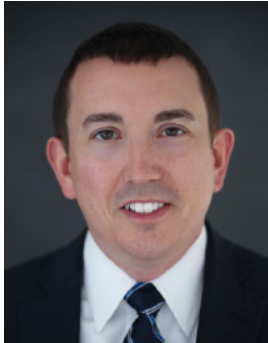
Lee J. Sacket, Esq.

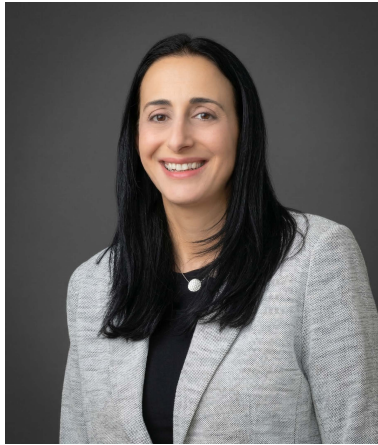
Staff quality is a primary factor separating good camps from great camps, and we all know the myriad staff issues many camps faced this past summer. Give your team the opportunity to be great!
